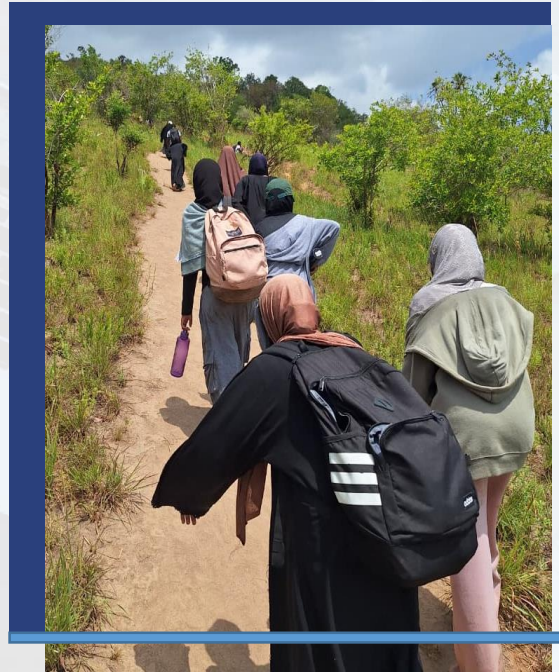

Senior Campus Flower Arrangement Activity

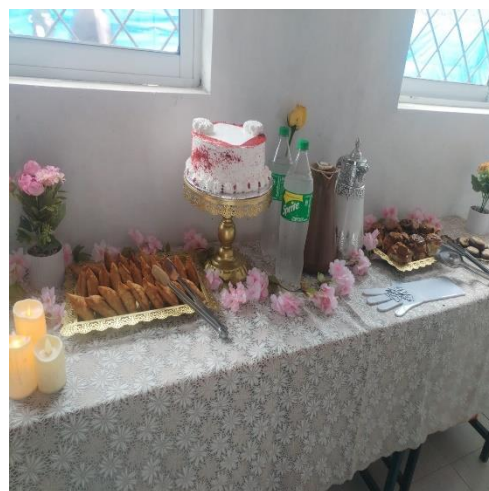
Date: 21st January 2026

Student Voice: "Seeing my parents admire my work made me feel confident and proud of my creativity."



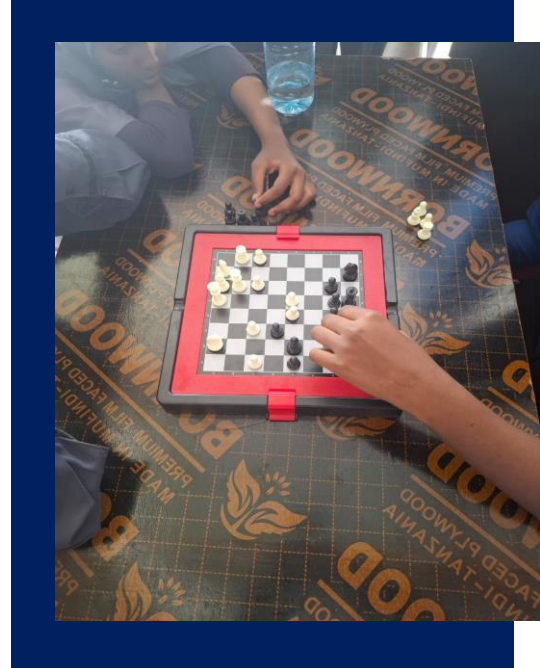
Senior Campus Sports Day – Interhouse Competition
